

Instructions for login on Sun Ray terminal

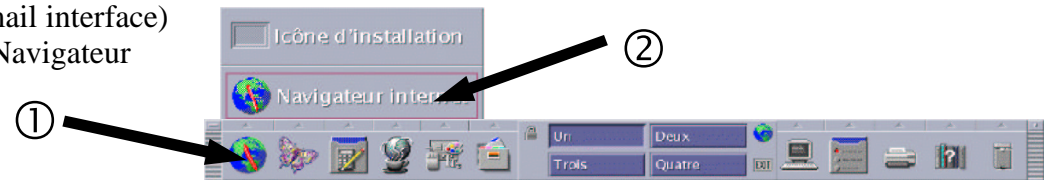
Depending on the previous terminal user, you may have or not have to skip one or several of the following initial steps.

If you find the terminal in the power-on state (equivalent), then watch carefully which text is displayed.

1. If it states « **Bienvenue sur x**** » (Where x** is between x1 and x15), then you need to switch to the central application server (apps): Select « Option|Connexion à distance|Choisir machine de la liste » with the mouse and release it. The following window should appear, where you can select the only entry (apps) by double-click.
2. If it states « **Bienvenue à la machine distante apps** », then you may login as user « h1 ». Ask the supervisor shift person (typically a CPPM member of H1 in the room) for the password.
3. When you have successfully logged in (or the previous user left the session open, as recommended), then you should see the following window with the CDE bar, which contains simple access menus and some tools.



4. You may browse the web (with Netscape, for reading your mail through a Webmail interface) by clicking the arrow above the globe menu in the CDE bar and selecting the "Navigateur internet" item.



5. You can open a command shell (zsh type) by clicking the Terminal button in the CDE center



6. From the command shell, you may call any available program which you find usefull, in particular
 - **ssh** (secure shell for login to distant hosts); *see remarks on keyboard below!*
 - **pine** (preconfigured for login to mail.desy.de via SSL); give your DESY-AFS username and password, they are *not* stored in the local configuration.
 - **mozilla** (version ??)

Important remarks about the french keyboard

Numbers are typed with the SHIFT KEY (or, alternatively NUMLOCK)! Think twice, *before* you mistype your usual password too often.

Special characters seem to be completely scrambled with respect to an english or german keyboard, which you might be used to from DESY.

You obtain the at-character (@), in the upper right part of the keyboard, with the « AltGr. » modifier key.

If you loose control of the mouse, you may type Ctrl-Moon (upper rightmost key) to wake it up. (This concerns rather "Sun" than "french".)
